We are currently seeking a female instructor for Brisbane but haven't had any luck as yet. I was hoping you may be able to help in this respect and/or your club may be interested in helping to organise the clinics.

The clinic in Darwin will be run with the help of the Darwin Flyrodders. In fact we used to belong to the Darwin Flyrodders. John the CEO of Recfish Australia started the club and also the Saltwater Fly Fishing Challenge that a number of your members attended. I was the secretary and Newsletter editor for a number of years.






