Secretary's Report

I was going through the minutes of some of the very early meetings (back in the days when they were taken at every meeting) and found it very interesting looking back on the early days of the SEQFFC. For those that were not around in the early days let me give you a little history of our club. The first meeting of the then unnamed SEQFFC was in on 16 July 1997. A total of 16 people

attended. Looking at those present at the first meeting there was a couple of names that still are around today, Jon Makim & Mario Demaio. Basically the formation of our club came about as a result of a group of like minded people wanting to get together to enjoy fly fishing (nothing much has changed really has it?). A decision was made at that meeting (held at Gecko House at Currumbin) to incorporate and the name SEQFFC was decided upon. Two months later the first AGM of the club was held and a committee was elected to guide the club through its first year. A few more familiar names appeared at that first AGM, Glenn & Annette Court, Steve Routleff & Bob Knott. The bank account had a few of hundred dollars in it and casting arvo's were held at the Goose Pond. For a number of years the club slowly grew with the occasional organised fishing trip and their monthly meeting.

Late in 2000 the club was struggling a little with a drop in membership numbers and fairly poor attendance's to its monthly meetings. In an attempt to pump a little life back into the club it decided to relocate our monthly meetings to a more central location and on 14 November 2000 the first meeting was held at Mermaid Beach Bowls Club. The change in location certainly had an impact as that first meeting had 11 visitors in addition to the regular members.

Tom Boylan at that stage was the Vice President however our appointed President was unable to make a lot of the meetings so it was left to Tom and the remainder of the committee to guide the club. Whilst we have had a number of changes in committee members over the last five years the one constant has been Tom and there can be no doubt he has been the driving force behind the success of the SEQFFC. Our membership now numbers around 50 (depending on who has and has not paid their annual fee) and continues to grow, we enjoy a club fishing outing at least once a month, our meetings are well attended, enjoyable and informative and we have been able to increase our profile and fly fishing generally by things such as the school program and seminars.

The strength of our club does and will continue to lie with its members. Get involved where you can especially with the Convention coming up in October, any help is always appreciated. For those of you that have not been on a club fishing trip do yourself a favour and get along to one of them. Once you have, believe me you will not want to miss one in the future.




